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NFL Primetime Games Week 6

In this week's NFL primetime games, the Kansas City Chiefs hosted the Denver Broncos on Thursday Night Football. Patrick Mahomes finished with 306 yards passing and an interception, and a big chunk of his production went to Travis Kelce, who had nine catches for 124 yards. As bad as the Broncos' defense has been this season, it was Russell Wilson and their offense that kept dragging them down. He had 37 yards passing in the first half, and the only drive Wilson led past midfield ended on fourth down. The Chiefs weren't doing a whole lot better. Their first three forays into the red zone netted three points, thanks to an interception by Justin Simmons and a failed QB sneak on fourth down. Mahomes, who has struggled by his standards all season, only found his rhythm once in the first half, when he ended a 62-yard drive with a short touchdown pass to Kadarius Toney. Harrison Butker made it 13-0 at the break when he drilled a 60-yard field goal as time expired. The Chiefs' red-zone woes continued in the second half, but in the end it didn't matter. The Chiefs came out winners 19-8.

Sunday Night Football hosted the Buffalo Bills vs the New York Giants. The Giants offense continued to be ineffective except for two consecutive plays where Saquon Barkley ran for 53 yards. Outside of that, New York totaled 316 yards on 73 plays. The Giants have injuries and questions galore but no answers. Josh Allen struggled, throwing for 169 yards on 5.6 yards per attempt with an interception. Yet when it mattered most, Allen led two touchdown drives, helping Buffalo rally from a 6-0 deficit. The effort was far from ideal against a struggling team, but the Bills did what was needed. The final score was 14-9.

Monday Night Football provided a game between the Dallas Cowboys and Los Angeles Chargers. The Cowboys and Chargers were back-and-forth nearly the whole game, with the majority of it sitting at a tie. In the end, the Cowboys won by just a field goal. Dak Prescott finished with 21-of-30 for 272 yards and a touchdown, plus 40 rushing yards and a touchdown. Herbert finished 22-of-37 for 227 yards with two touchdowns and one interception. The final score was 20-17. The Cowboys improved to 4-2 and have their bye this week. The Chargers are just coming off their bye week. They fall to 2-3 and will face AFC West rivals and leaders, the Kansas City Chiefs on Sunday.
