In this week's Premier League action, Brighton traveled to Villa Park to face Aston Villa. Both sides are adjacent to each other on the Premier League table, with Villa in 5th and Brighton in 6th. Brighton's strong run seemed to falter as Villa secured a resounding 6-1 victory.

In the subsequent match, Arsenal confronted Bournemouth, who are second from the bottom. Arsenal confidently won 4-0, elevating them to 3rd on the Premier League table. They are gearing up for one of the season's most anticipated matches next week against 1st place Manchester City.

Luton clashed with Everton, with both teams aspiring to uplift their seasons, as they reside in the bottom half of the table. Luton edged out a 2-1 victory, propelling them out of the relegation zone to 17th place.

Crystal Palace squared off against a struggling Manchester United, who have only secured 3 victories in their 7 matches this season. Crystal Palace's impressive run continues, occupying 9th place after a 1-0 victory over United.

Newcastle faced Burnley and emerged victorious with a 2-0 scoreline, advancing to 8th. Burnley's woes persist as they are currently within the relegation zone in 18th position.

West Ham engaged with last-placed Sheffield United, clinching a 2-0 win. This marks West Ham's 4th victory in their last 7 outings, solidifying their spot in 7th place.

Wolves challenged league leaders Manchester City. Wolves, perilously close to the relegation zone in 16th, defied expectations by handing City their first loss of the season in a 2-1 outcome. This triumph was punctuated with a late goal from Hwang Hee-Chan.

In the weekend's marquee matchup, Tottenham faced off against Liverpool. Both sides are comfortably positioned within the top 4. Liverpool was reduced to 10 players early on due to a 26th-minute red card issued to Curtis Jones. Their challenges compounded when Diogo Jota received a red card in the 69th minute. With the scoreline level at 1-1 entering extra time, Tottenham clinched a dramatic 2-1 win in the 96th minute following an own goal from Joel Matip.

To conclude the weekend's fixtures, Brentford and Nottingham Forest, positioned closely at 14th and 13th respectively, played out as 1-1 draw.
