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### San Francisco 49ers Week Six Recap

Week six of the NFL season is over and let's take a look at how the San Francisco 49ers did. The 49ers visited the Cleveland Browns at FirstEnergy Stadium. The Browns were without starting quarterback Deshaun Watson, so PJ Walker got the start. The 49ers were without starting linebacker Dre Greenlaw, so Demetrius Flannigan-Fowles started in his place. The game started with a 49ers score, coming from a 13 yard touchdown pass from Brock Purdy to Christian McCaffrey. The score remained 7-0, until the second quarter when Jake Moody nailed a 25 yard field goal to bring the score to 10-0. The Browns put some points on the board before the half, with Kareem Hunt breaking off a 16 yard touchdown run with the score at 10-7 going into halftime. The third quarter featured only field goals, with Dustin Hopkins connecting from 42 and 46 yards to give the Browns the 13-10 lead heading into the fourth quarter. The 49ers defense created a big turnover with Deommodore Lenoir intercepting a pass from PJ Walker. This turnover set up a eight yard touchdown run from Jordan Mason, giving the 49ers a 17-13 lead. The Browns responded with two more field goals from Dustin Hopkins, one from 50 yards and the other from 29 yards. This gave the Browns the 19-17 lead with under two minutes remaining. Brock Purdy led the offense down the field and put them in field goal range. Jake

Moody was not able to nail the 41 yard field goal for the win, resulting in the 49ers first loss of the season, bringing their record to 5-1. Next up, the 49ers head to Minnesota to play the Vikings on Monday Night Football. Something to keep an eye on are the injuries for the 49ers. Three key players in Deebo Samuel, Trent Williams, and Christian McCaffrey are all battling injuries.
