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NFL Primetime Games Week 5

In this week's NFL primetime games, the Washington Commanders hosted the Chicago Bears. Quarterback and wide receiver duo, Justin Fields and D.J. Moore dominated throughout the game. Fields threw for 282 yards on 15/29 passing, with 4 passing touchdowns. D.J. Moore had 230 of those 282 passing yards.. Moore also caught three of the passing touchdowns. Commanders Quarterback, Sam Howell, threw for 388 yards on 37/51 attempts, with 2 touchdowns. The Commanders defense let the offense down, giving up 40 points. The Chicago Bears came out winners 40-20 to get their first win of the season.

Sunday Night Football hosted the game of the season so far. The San Francisco 49ers took on the Dallas Cowboys. Brock Purdy and the San Francisco 49ers quickly turned the biggest challenge of their young season into a laugh. Dak Prescott struggled throughout the game throwing for 153 yards and 3 interceptions. Purdy finished 17 for 24 for 252 yards and has not thrown an interception this season. He connected on a 19-yard TD pass to Kittle on the opening drive, a 38-yarder early in the second quarter on a reverse flea-flicker and then a 10-yarder to put the game away in the third quarter (George Kittle, Christian McCaffrey, Kyle Juszczyk, and Jordan Mason). Purdy threw three of his four touchdown passes to George Kittle, San Francisco's defense hounded Dak Prescott all night and the 49ers extended their dominance over the Dallas Cowboys with a 42-10 victory Sunday.

Week 5 of the 2023 NFL season came to a close Monday with the Las Vegas Raiders playing host to the Green Bay Packers. The Raiders picked off Packers quarterback Jordan Love three times, with linebacker Robert Spillane grabbing two and cornerback Amik Robertson clinching the game with an end zone pick with 44 seconds left. Love threw for 182 yards on 16-of-30 passing for the Packers, who scored their only touchdown on a third-quarter AJ Dillon run. Davante Adams had four catches for 45 yards against his former team, while Jimmy Garoppolo threw for 208 yards and a touchdown. Both teams moved to 2-3 after the game. The Raiders play the Patriots while Green Bay heads into its bye week.
