

Sebastian Vettel's Sustainability Projects

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Four-time Formula 1 World Champion Sebastian Vettel is no stranger to green projects and sustainability, so let's dive into some of his most notable accomplishments: the bee hotels.

Suzuka's *Buzzin' Corner*

As Formula 1 returns to Japan this upcoming weekend, let's revisit Sebastian Vettel's *Buzzin' Corner*, the biodiversity initiative that created wooden homes for bees at turn 2 of the Suzuka International Racing Course.

The curbs around the corner (usually painted red and white) were even painted yellow and black for the special occasion. Before the 2023 Japanese Grand Prix, Vettel offered for the drivers to join him in decorating the hotels, donning the wooden structures in additional black and yellow designs ranging from stripes to Ferrari logos to hearts with teammates' names.

However, Suzuka wasn't the first of its kind. In 2021, Vettel worked with local schoolchildren to build a bee hotel near the Austrian race track. Designed by the children themselves in the form of a racing car, the hotel is surrounded by varieties of flowers, and serves as a place for biodiversity to flourish.

Vettel wanted to specifically work with children in order to promote an interest in species protection and sustainable futures amongst younger generations.
